
About Us

Rapid Clinic is a walk-in, acute care clinic for minor illnesses and injuries. The entrance to Rapid Clinic is immediately to the right of the Emergency Department entrance. It provides diagnosis and treatment of many minor illnesses and injuries. For symptoms that won't wait for an appointment, come to the Rapid Clinic.

Rapid Clinic is not an urgent care and visits are billed as clinic appointments. Please note that this type of visit might be out of network for those from outside of the area.

FAQ

Who can come to Rapid Clinic?

Rapid Clinic can see patients who are six months or older. Most insurance plans are accepted.

When should I visit Rapid Clinic?

When you have an illness or injury that is not life-threatening. (See the adjoining page for examples of services provided in the Rapid Clinic.)

Any serious injuries or life-threatening conditions should go to the emergency room. If the provider determines that you need a higher level of care that cannot be provided in the Rapid Clinic, you will be referred to the emergency room for further evaluation.

Who will see me?

You will be seen by highly-qualified providers who will be able to diagnose and treat most minor illnesses and injuries. If you need to see your primary care provider, you should make an appointment to do so.

Can I make an appointment?

No. Rapid Clinic staff will see patients in the order they arrive.

Can I go to Rapid Clinic for prescription refills or ongoing conditions?

No. Rapid Clinic is not intended to replace the care of your primary care provider. For routine and ongoing medical care, please make an appointment.
